

Admission and Enrollment Policies:

Prospective students:

- Meet with the director or assistant director for a tour and admission interview
- Will be furnished admission and enrollment agreements, as well as our most current student handbook
- Be given information about our financial plans and policies
- Have any and all questions answered to the best of our school's ability or be directed to staff at TDLR who can answer them

Be aware that a prospective student is ineligible for state licensure if he or she has been convicted of, pled guilty to, entered a plea of nolo contendere/no contest to, or received a deferred adjudication to prostitution or another sexual offense, until the fifth anniversary from the date of conviction for a misdemeanor of moral turpitude or a felony, or the fifth anniversary from the date of conviction of a violation of the Massage Therapy Act. The 84th Texas State Legislature defines massage therapy education as "post-secondary education", thus students can no longer enroll in massage therapy school unless they are beyond the age of compulsory education; an emancipated minor; or have a high school diploma, GED, or home school certificate. Students who have completed their secondary education prior to age 18 must have a parent or guardian sign the enrollment agreement.

Admitted students:

- Will furnish a copy of their state ID and social security card to be retained in their school file
- Have student kit fees paid one week before the start of class
- Have their tuition plan or payment approved before or on the first day of class
- Meet all financial obligations in a timely manner, as agreed on by the director and student
- Follow all rules as set out in the current school handbook
